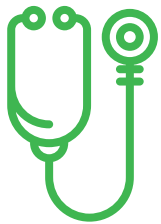

Frequently Asked Questions

Wolves Wellness School Based Health Center, in partnership with HealthSource of Ohio, provides primary medical, vision, and behavioral health services to West Clermont School District students, staff, and eventually the entire community. Wolves Wellness is open Monday through Friday and will remain open during school breaks, including summer break.



Where is Wolves Wellness School Based Health Center Located? Who provides the transportation?

Wolves Wellness School Based Health Center is located inside West Clermont Middle School, 1341 Clough Pike, Cincinnati, 45103. Transportation provided by West Clermont Schools is available to take students from the elementary schools and high school to the Health Center.

What services does the School Based Health Center provide?

- Routine physical exams, including wellness checks, sports and work physicals
- Asthma and other chronic illness diagnosis and management
- Acute illness and injury treatment
- Immunizations and vaccinations
- Routine lab tests
- Medication prescriptions
- Health education, counseling, and wellness promotion
- Fitness and nutrition education and counseling
- Referrals for health care services not provided at the School Based Health Center including behavioral health, vision, and dental services, and other medical services
- Case management for acute and chronic health problems



What vision services does Wolves Wellness School Based Health Center provide?

The Vision Center is located within the School-Based Health Center. Services include: complete vision exams, vision screening, eyewear for students with Medicaid coverage.

How does using Wolves Wellness School Based Health Center benefit me and my child?

Utilizing the School Based Health Center keeps students in school and able to return to class quicker when they are sick. Parents use less time away from work because the School Based Health Center clinician treats your child during the school day. **School Based Health, however, is not a replacement of your Primary Care Provider.**

What types of insurance does the School Based Health Center take?

HealthSource of Ohio accepts most insurance plans, including Medicaid, Caresource, Molina, Buckeye, Paramount, United, and private insurance. We also accept uninsured patients.

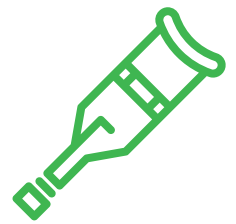


Who is the clinician my child will see at the School Based Health Center?

Dena Richter, C-FNP, is the clinician at Wolves Wellness; she is employed by HealthSource of Ohio. Dena is a 1992 graduate of Glen Este High School. She received her BA degree from Indiana Wesleyan University, and Master of Science and Post Master of Nursing Degrees at the University of Cincinnati.

How does School Based Health work?

- Parent/Guardian enrolls student in SBHC programs
- School nurse/health aide will determine student needs to be seen at the SBHC
- Parent is called to confirm student can be seen
- Student is transported to the SBHC
- Student sees the Nurse Practitioner or Vision Center
- Student is transported back to school
- Summary of visit is sent home with the student
- Appropriate insurance is billed for services
